

- P6 students and parents can make applications via a common online portal from the 2020 DSA-Sec Exercise.

Direct School Admission

- Primary 6 students can apply for DSA-Sec based on a wide-range of talents, including:
 - Sports and games
 - Visual, literary and performing arts
 - Debate and public speaking
 - Science, mathematics and engineering
 - Languages and humanities
 - Uniformed groups
 - Leadership (e.g. prefects)






To enhance work-life harmony for all our staff, we would like to seek your support to communicate with staff only on weekdays and during school operations hours (7.15 am - 5.30 pm).



IP schools report lower cut-off points





Drop probably due to smaller PSLE cohort and lower overall T-scores

A smaller cohort in this year's Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE), along with lower T-scores overall, could be the reason that most schools offering the Integrated Programme (IP) reported lower cut-off points yesterday.

Hwa Chong Institution's (HCI) cut-off, for instance, came down from 261 last year to 256, while Raffles Institution's dropped from 263 to 259 - confirming expectations from many parents that their children stood a better chance of getting into popular IP schools this time round.

Weeks before the Secondary 1 postings were released yesterday, there were already discussions about how this year's cohort size and lower T-scores overall would affect their children.

SINGAPORE - The minimum entry requirement for popular secondary schools was raised by between two and eight points this year.

The increased scores - which are aggregated from four subjects at the Primary School Leaving Examination - follow a record performance by this year's cohort.

Schools with the highest cut-off points include Nanyang Girls' High, which took the lead with 264 points un from 262 lact wear



The score for both Methodist Girls' School and Raffles Institution rose from 256 last year to 261, while that for Raffles Girls' School went up by two points to 260.

Hwa Chong Institution's cut-off went up by four points to 260, while Dunman High School's score was 258, compared to 253 last year.

The cut-off scores for CHIJ St Nicholas Girls' School's Integrated Programme and O-level track this year were 258 and 253 respectively, up from 253 and 245 last year.
